We are very pleased to announce the official launch of the RMAIS website!

GDPE's RMAIS (Research Mentoring to Advance Inclusivity in STEM) Program was initiated by Co-PIs Colleen Webb, Meena Balgopal, and Jennifer Neuwald in 2017. Through this initiative, we proudly supported the research of 14 graduate students for both 2018 and 2019 as they mentored undergraduates throughout the summer and developed modules geared toward the intersectionality of gender and STEM.

The new website provides these modules on Mentoring, Professional Development, and Intersectionality to our GDPE, CSU, and broader academic communities.

Many of you may be discussing ways to bring diversity and inclusivity into lab meeting conversations. We encourage you to review these modules and use them to inspire these valuable discussions.

We look forward to continuing to engage with our GDPE community and hope you will join us as we find ways of expanding these efforts in the future.

Dear GDPE Community,

In this time of COVID-19, there have been many less-than-positive alterations to what we used to consider normal. This has certainly been true for the operations of GDPE, and it is easy to dwell on what we haven't been able to do. Thus, when positive outcomes happen during this period of disruption, it's important to note these as well. One of these is the launching of the RMAIS website (see details to the left).

Additionally, as many of you know, some unexpected year-end funds became available to GDPE with a very short timeline for spending them. We put out a call to GDPE Students and Faculty to help us disperse these funds by allowing us to purchase for you needed PPE, research supplies, and other items to assist you in your research.

We quickly learned that, like a teenager's appetite, your needs for such funds are insatiable.

While we were not able to fund all requests, or fund each request fully, we were able to provide resources (an average of \$400-500) to fund requests from ~16 students and 6 faculty (some orders are still being placed). Congrats to those that received support!

Note: because of limitations on budget carry-over from one year to the next, we need to spend programmatic funds completely (normally this is NOT a problem for GDPE) – so if you have made a request


